DESCRIPTION

The Rancho Santa Fe Fire Protection District (District) has an opportunity available to join the team as a **Firefighter/Paramedic – Lateral (FF/PM)**. Lateral candidates must possess a minimum of twenty-four (24) months of continuous full-time firefighting experience and have completed probation as a paid FF/PM with a municipal, county, state, fire district, federal, or tribal all-risk fire agency. Candidates must be currently employed at the time of application.

This is an open and continuous recruitment. Applications are accepted at any time. When the District is actively hiring, an application closing date will be posted at www.ranchosantafefire.gov.

All required licenses and certifications must remain current throughout the entire examination and hiring process. To maintain current records, the applicant must resubmit their application with updated documentation any time a credential is renewed during the process prior to application closing.

Upon closing, all applications received will be reviewed for completeness and the most qualified individuals will be selected to continue in the hiring process.

The successful candidate will possess the following knowledge, skills/abilities, experience, and characteristics:

Knowledge & Education:

Education:

- Equivalent to completion of the twelfth (12th) grade.

Knowledge of:

- Firefighting principles, techniques, and suppression methods, including fire behavior and fire prevention.
- San Diego County paramedic protocols for assessment and treatment of the ill and injured.
- Emergency rescue procedures and practices relating to fire, traffic collisions, technical rescue, HAZMAT, and other life-threatening or injury-prone events.
- Apparatus and equipment mechanics, maintenance, and operations.
- Laws, ordinances, and codes affecting the work of a FF/PM.
- Appropriate safety precautions and procedures.

Skills & Abilities:

- Perform a diverse range of emergency response and firefighting duties.
- Operate hoses, hydrants, compressors, and a variety of gas and electrically powered equipment.
- Apply the principles, practices, and procedures of modern firefighting and protection of life and property.
- Evaluate emergency response conditions and act when not directly supervised.
- Respond quickly to changing situations under stressful conditions.
- Operate computers and other electronic devices, write comprehensive reports, and maintain accurate records.

Experience & Licenses:

Experience:

- Lateral: Twenty-four (24) months of continuous full-time firefighting experience and completion of probation as a paid FF/PM with a municipal, county, state, fire district, federal, or tribal all-risk fire agency.

Licenses and Certifications:

- Possession of a valid Driver's License with a satisfactory driving record at time of application.
- Possession of a valid California State Paramedic License, to be maintained throughout employment.
- Possession of one of the following Firefighter I credentials:
 - California State Fire Marshal (CSFM) Firefighter I Certificate; or
 - Completion of a Fire Academy accredited by the Office of the California State Fire Marshal; or
 - Proof of completed California Reciprocity through State Fire Training for Firefighter I; or
 - IFSAC/Pro Board certification covering Firefighter I, Hazardous Materials (FRA, FRO, Decon, Product Stabilization), and Wildland Firefighter I.
- Paramedic Accreditation with the San Diego County Emergency Medical Services Agency (EMS) at time of hire, to be maintained throughout employment.

Ability to obtain and maintain one of the following California Driver's License options within 18 months of employment:

- Valid California Class "C" Driver's License with Firefighter Endorsement; or
- Valid non-commercial California Class "B" Firefighter Restricted Driver License with Air Brake and Tank endorsements; or
- Valid Commercial Class "A" or Class "B" Unrestricted driver license with Air Brake, Tank, and Firefighter endorsements.

Characteristics

Application and Selection Process:

Candidates that successfully pass the screening process may be invited to participate in the steps below:

FF Skills Assessment & Knowledge Center / Paramedic Medical Simulation	Candidates who successfully pass the skills assessments will be invited to continue onto the Captain's interview.
Captain's Interview	Candidates who pass the Captain's interview will be invited to continue onto the Fire Chief's interview.
Fire Chief's Interview	Candidates will be contacted by the department in ranked order to start the background process as vacancies arise.
North Zone Physical Agility Test	All successful candidates without a current CPAT will be required to pass the North Zone Agility Test after the Fire Chief's Interview.

Candidates that are placed onto the eligibility list will undergo a thorough background investigation, medical exam, and psychological evaluation. Candidates must successfully pass all components of the hiring process.

Background Investigation - Candidates who receive a conditional offer will be referred to a background investigation. The background investigation includes, but is not limited to, a Personal History Statement, Department of Justice/FBI criminal records check, civil records check, employment and personal reference checks, DMV check, etc.

Medical and Psychological Exam - Candidates who are recommended following the background investigation will receive a second conditional offer of employment. They must pass a comprehensive medical examination including drug and alcohol screening and are required to submit to a psychological examination. The medical exam is conducted through the district's designated physician and the initial exam costs are paid by the district. COMMUNITY

Rancho Santa Fe is an unincorporated community in northern San Diego County, California, known for its residential character, equestrian heritage, and rolling terrain. The community sits inland from the coast and provides easy access to the cultural, recreational, and educational opportunities of greater San Diego, including beaches, mountains, and a temperate Southern California climate.

THE ORGANIZATION

The district has served its community since 1946. The district is an independent special district governed by a Board of Directors and operates 6 fire stations providing all-risk fire suppression, emergency medical, rescue, and prevention services to Rancho Santa Fe and surrounding areas.

The district works cooperatively with neighboring fire agencies through automatic and mutual aid agreements, including participation in the San Diego County North Zone.

ESSENTIAL DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

Under the direction of a Company Officer, a FF/PM provides basic and advanced life support services to ill or injured persons in accordance with the policies established by the Department of Emergency Medical Services of San Diego County. The FF/PM is responsible for performing the duties of a firefighter assigned to engine companies and other specialized District apparatus. Essential job duties include, but are not limited to:

- Suppress fires, perform rescues, and carry out emergency medical techniques and procedures.
- Operate, maintain, and inspect vehicles, apparatus, and equipment.
- Respond quickly to changing situations under stressful conditions.
- Learn local geography, demographics, locations, and regulations.
- Clean and maintain fire stations, District facilities, and grounds.
- Conduct fire inspections and participate in public education activities.
- Understand and follow oral and written directions promptly and accurately.
- Pass periodic recertification tests.
- Operate computers and other electronic devices, write comprehensive reports, and maintain accurate records.
- Establish and maintain effective relationships with those in contact during the course of work.

QUALIFICATIONS GUIDELINES

Required at Time of Application:

- Valid Driver's License with a satisfactory driving record.
- Current California State Paramedic License (must be maintained as a condition of employment).
- Applicants must submit proof of one of the following:
 - California State Fire Marshal (CSFM) Firefighter I Certificate; or
 - Completion of a Fire Academy accredited by the Office of the California State Fire Marshal; or
 - Proof of completed California Reciprocity through State Fire Training for Firefighter I; or
 - IFSAC/Pro Board accredited certification that includes Firefighter I, Hazardous Materials (FRA, FRO, Decon, Product Stabilization), and Wildland Firefighter I. Candidates qualifying under this pathway who have not completed California Reciprocity must be eligible and willing to complete the State Fire Training Reciprocity process (including the firefighter certification exam, written, and skills) as a condition of hire.

Lateral Candidate Requirements:

- Currently employed as a full-time FF/PM (or higher) with a municipal, county, state, fire district, federal, or tribal all-risk fire agency.
- Minimum of twenty-four (24) months of continuous full-time firefighting experience and completion of probation as a paid FF/PM.

Highly Desirable:

- Current California Class “C” driver's license with Firefighter endorsement, or a Commercial Class “B” driver's license.
- California State Fire Marshal Firefighter I and II Certificates.
- Current CPAT (Candidate Physical Ability Test) card.

Additional Requirements / Conditions of Employment:

- All successful candidates without a current CPAT will be required to pass the North Zone Agility Test after the Fire Chief's Interview.
- Possess current Paramedic Accreditation with the San Diego County Emergency Medical Services Agency (EMS) at time of hire.
- A California Class “C” driver's license with Firefighter endorsement, or a Commercial Class “B” driver's license, must be obtained within 18 months of employment and maintained throughout employment.

PHYSICAL/MENTAL DEMANDS AND WORK ENVIRONMENT

The conditions described herein are representative of those that must be met by an incumbent to successfully perform the essential functions of this classification. Reasonable accommodations may be made to enable individuals with disabilities to perform the essential job functions.

Environmental: Standard fire station setting with some travel to various locations to attend meetings or respond to emergency scenes, disasters, or critical incidents; occasional exposure to excessive noise, dust, grease, smoke, fumes, airborne particles, noxious odors, gases, explosives, and bloodborne pathogens; and all types of weather and temperature conditions; occasionally works near moving mechanical parts, in areas of limited and restricted entry and exit, and in high precarious places; exposure to vibration from equipment and vehicles; operation of foot controls or repetitive foot motion; extensive public contact; the noise level in the work environment is usually moderate; however, the noise level may be very loud when responding to emergency calls and when working at a fire or other emergency incident; wears appropriate personal protective equipment including goggles, face protector, turn-outs, safety shoes, and self-contained breathing apparatus; may be required to travel outside the District boundaries to attend meetings. Work environment is both formal and informal, team-oriented, with variable tasks, pace, and pressure.

Physical: Primary functions require sufficient physical ability to work in a fire station and operate office equipment and to respond to 911 emergencies. CONTINUOUS sitting and upward and downward flexion of neck; side-to-side turning of neck; reaching below the shoulders; fine finger dexterity; simple grasping and repetitive use of hands. FREQUENT walking and walking on uneven ground; twisting at waist; light to moderate finger pressure to manipulate keyboard, equipment controls, and office equipment; pinch grasp to manipulate writing utensils. OCCASIONAL standing, running, crawling, kneeling, climbing, balancing, and squatting; bending at the waist; reaching at and above shoulder height; pushing and pulling; power grasping to pick up equipment; may lift and carry objects weighing more than 100 pounds with or without assistance; operate a vehicle to travel to various locations; operate fire suppression and medical response equipment, apparatus, and tools; verbally communicate to exchange information.

Vision and Hearing:

Vision: Must see in order to perform essential job tasks; respond to incidents, provide care; operate emergency vehicles and apparatus; keep records, operate a computer, and perform office work; maintain station and equipment. Must be sufficient to meet NFPA Medical Evaluation criteria.

Hearing: Must hear instructions, radio messages, and emergency tones, alarms, and other warning devices; sufficient to perform essential job tasks. Must be sufficient to meet NFPA Medical Evaluation criteria.
